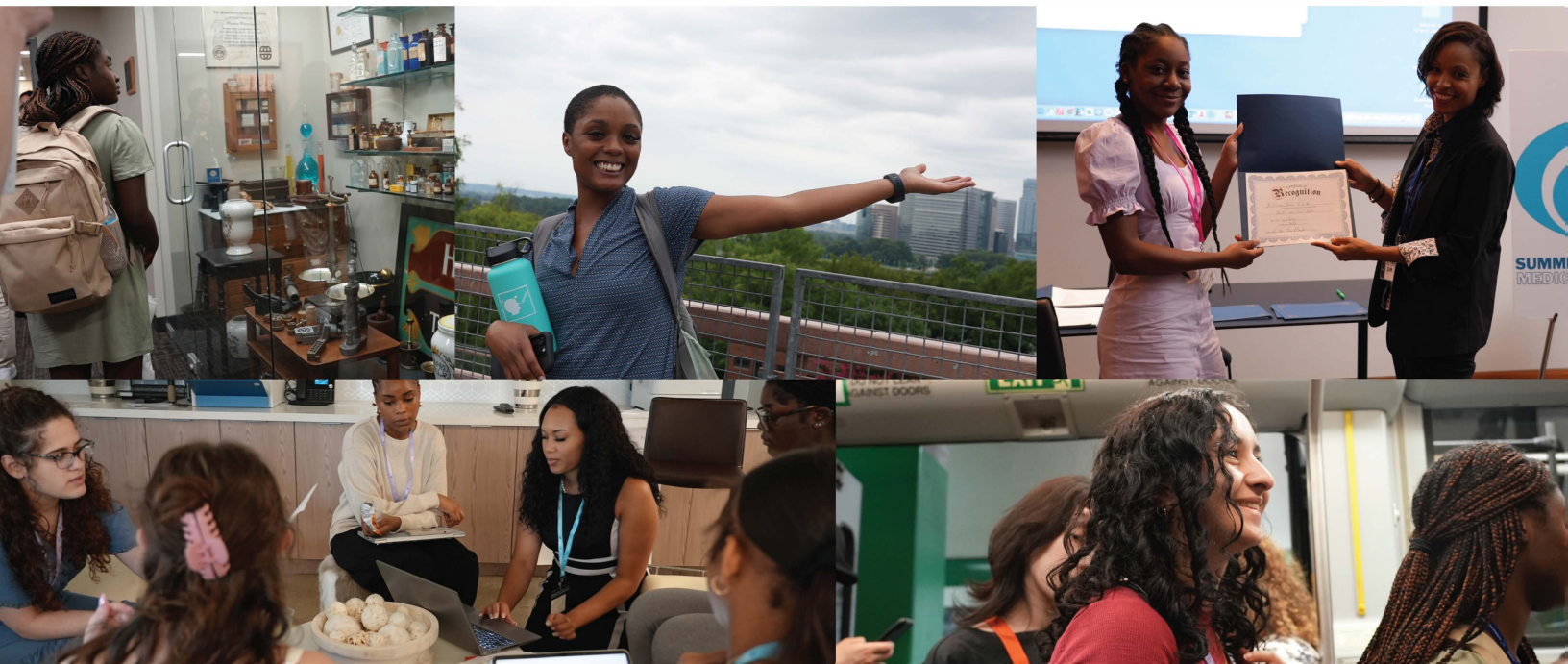




BOSTON CONGRESS OF PUBLIC HEALTH



About the Boston Congress of Public Health Inc.

The **Boston Congress of Public Health Inc. (BCPH)** is a 501(c)3 nonprofit organization that seeks to democratize access to evidence-based public health resources and platforms. BCPH realizes this mission by supporting emerging and established thought leaders, including researchers, advocates, grassroots organizers, and others aligned with the public health field, committed to social justice and health equity.



Led by Co-CEOs **Dr. Candice Carpenter** and **Dr. Circe Gray Le Compte**, BCPH supports underrepresented public health issues and advocates, and facilitates programs organized under two activity centers:





BCPH Studio

Produces translational knowledge through diverse mediums (blogs, vlogs, podcasts, TV series, and academic journals, including HPHR Journal) across multiple platforms (two websites, HPHR.org and BCPH.org, YouTube, TikTok, and other social media).



BCPH Thought Leadership Fellowship for Public Health

Supports the next generation of thought leaders as they design, develop, and disseminate their public health platform. Fellows engage in networking and special events and, upon completion of the program, participate in a special graduation ceremony and receive a certificate.



HPHR Journal

Formerly known as Harvard Public Health Review, HPHR is an independent, academic journal that translates public health thought through the lens of health equity and social justice. The Journal has a dedicated ISSN and DOI, and is featured in major indexes. HPHR.org is home to the Journal's 70+ editions, as well as over 400 blogs, vlogs, and podcasts.



Public Health History Mysteries

A streaming program, features Dr. Cressida, a puppet panther, who guides viewers through historical events that transformed public health.



Websites, Emailers, and Social Media

BCPH maintains two websites. BCPH.org provides access to organizational and programmatic information and registration, while HPHR.org serves as interconnected platform for the agency's Studio content, namely HPHR Journal and its blogs, podcasts, columns, and social media/digital channels: YouTube, TikTok, LinkedIn, Facebook, Instagram, and Twitter.



Great Health Debates Series

Great Health Debates Series convenes diverse leaders to engage in rich, thought-provoking, and critical debate of major controversies and innovations in the field of public health. Two seasons have been made so far and are available with permission on the organization's YouTube channel and as part of a learning curriculum through BCPH Studio.



Season 1 – Great Health Debates:

Hosted by Dr. Rob Carpenter, director of the documentary *American Dropout* and author of *The 48 Laws of Happiness*, the **Great Health Debates** inaugural season encompassed eight (8) episodes on vaccine mandates; substance use and harm reduction; drug decriminalization; medical bias; mental illness and over-medication; body positivity and anti-obesity efforts; AI and medical care; and reparations and justice.

Season 2 – Global Health Debates:

BCPH designed these four (4) episodes to address major controversies and innovations in climate change and health; migration and social unrest; transnational corporations and regulation; and decolonizing global health. Series was hosted by Dr. Natasha Matthews, a global health advocate and Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health graduate.

Season 3 – Great Health Debates: The Promise and Peril of Cultural Competency in Healthcare.

The mini-series is specifically devoted to dissecting a myriad of topics, including disability and healthcare, medical gaslighting, challenges of health equity, and the legacy of compulsory cultural competency training. It will be hosted by Fatou Barry, a global health advocate and graduate of the NYU School of Public Health.



BCPH Academy

BCPH Academy develops and delivers high-quality, public health trainings on a state-of-the-art learning platform to researchers, clinicians, community-based professionals and advocates, policymakers, academic professionals, students, medical and surgical residents, and others from the U.S. and abroad. Courses explore intersectional public health topics, such as planetary health and climate change and offer opportunities to earn certificates and/or continuing education credits.



BCPH Public Health Leadership Institute

The BCPH Public Health Leadership Institute provides participants, including **students from** universities and colleges, and baccalaureate, behavioral, and clinical programs, a transformational educational experience through which to learn and apply public health skills in health equity and social justice. More than 100 students and faculty convened for three week-long Institutes in Boston, MA, and Washington, DC in 2023. In addition to more than 30 unique courses, participants received tours of leading universities, alongside visits to the Capitol and the National Library. Students received certificates of completion for the Institute and specific courses. Those who achieved the requisite scores on the final exam earned an honors transcript, signifying their exceptional grasp of the material.

The awards honor those making significant advances in public health through innovative interventions, entrepreneurship, research, organizational management, intervention development, qualitative/quantitative innovation, social engagement, and more. Nominees must address issues of justice and equity, especially within underserved populations.

Health Innovators to Watch Awards

The awards honor the work of individuals who have made significant advances to the field of public health through innovative programs and interventions, entrepreneurship, research, organizational management, intervention development, qualitative/quantitative innovation, social engagement, and more. Programs must address issues of justice and equity, **notably with** marginalized groups.

Lyon Speakers Bureau

The Lyon Speakers Bureau, named in honor of Cordella Lyon, a dynamic leader in the field of HIV and the inaugural president of the BCPH Advisory Board, recruits and promotes diverse speakers worldwide, including leaders, advocates, and clinicians addressing inequities and enacting dynamic solutions through the lens of social justice. Speakers are made available to organizations seeking experts for conferences, faculty, and more.
