

BCPH Review (BCPHR)

BCPHR began at Harvard University as the Harvard Public Health Review (HPHR), and is now an independent, academic journal published by the Boston Congress of Public Health. The Journal translates public health thought through the lens of equity and social justice. We have published more than 1400 authors globally, in nearly 90 **special editions**.

We also publish **supplements**, as well blogs, vlogs, and podcasts. BCPHR is **open access**, features a dedicated ISSN and DOI, and is in major indexes. BCPH is available through **BCPHR.org**, with editions published in 2025 and onward additionally accessible through **BCPHReview.org**.



BCPHR Editorial Fellowship

This two-month virtual editorial fellowship provides aspiring editorial leaders hands-on training journal management, participating in online trainings and taking turns serving as Reviewers, Associate Editors, and Managing Editors of BCPHR. Fellows manage submissions, review and provide recommendations on manuscripts, communicate with authors, and participate in meetings with editorial staff.



Fellowships

BCPH Research Scholars Program

The BCPH Research Scholars Program trains aspiring public health leaders in academic writing and research.

Participants work with a mentor to produce a manuscript, poster, and live webinar presentation. Scholars ultimately submit their articles to BCPHR Review, providing them with experience with the peer review process.



BCPH World Delegate Program



BCPH's World Delegates Program seeks to expand public health leadership and outreach in the U.S. and globally to advance health equity, social justice, and collaboration. Delegates help establish a global communication and leadership network that:

- Strengthens BCPH's reach domestically and abroad
- Showcases emerging voices in public health
- Creates a pipeline for journal submissions, webinars, and conferences
- Amplifies public health initiatives worldwide.

BCPH Thought Leadership for Public Health Program

The Thought Fellowship program incubates the next generation of thought leaders in public health.

Fellows participate in two months of technical training and content workshopping followed by several weeks of content creation and promotion.

BCPHAcademy.org delivers high-quality, public health trainings on a state-of-the-art asynchronous learning platform. Courses explore intersectional public health topics, such as planetary health and climate change, and offer opportunities to earn certificates. Continuing education credits will be offered in the next year.

BCPH offers regular lunchtime trainings featuring researchers and program representatives from diverse disciplines.

Past topics have focused on social entrepreneurship, global health ethics, HIV criminalization, AI robotics in health care, maternal and child health, trauma and healing, emotionally intelligent communication, sexual health and joy, nutritional education, and LGBTQ+ health care communication, and more.
